Report Summary:

NEW PROGRAM:

The **Public Health** (AS.PBH) program will provide students with the knowledge and skills necessary to obtain entry level employment in the region or transfer to a 4-year institution.

PROGRAM MODIFICATIONS:

The <u>Medical Reimbursement & Coding Program (AAS.MIS, CS.MIS) programs</u> have been modified to align required courses with employer needs.

The <u>Pre-Mortuary (AS.MOR) program</u> has been modified to align program requirements with transfer institutions. The following program proposals have been approved by the Academic Committee of the Senate, the Senate, and VP of Academic Affairs. Each proposal meets all requirements for a program.

NEW PROGRAM

Program Name: Public Health (AS.PBH)

Rationale: There has been an increased awareness of the need for Public Health employees because of the Pandemic. Accordingly, occupations associated with this program are in-demand occupations as designated by the PA Center for Workforce Information & Analysis (2022). According to the Center, occupations associated with this degree are projected to increase by 16.3% between 2020 and 2030. The average annual salary for related occupations is \$44,000. Additionally, several 4-year colleges offer baccalaureate Public Health programs making this program amenable to transfer. Moreover, this program may be a good fit and possibility for NURS-GEN students who are not accepted into the NUR program but still interested in a career in the health sciences. This program may also attract business students interested in working in a healthcare setting.

Program Mission/Description

The AS in Public Health integrates fundamental concepts and principles of public health with the natural sciences, social sciences, and technology to develop a public health world view. Students will acquire knowledge and skills necessary to protect and promote the health of individuals, families and communities through education and research. Students who complete the AS in Public Health will be prepared for transfer to four-year colleges and universities.

Goals:

The program provides the student the opportunity to:

- 1. Develop a base of substantive knowledge about the concepts, research and practice of public health and natural sciences, social sciences, and technology.
- 2. Acquire the introductory skills necessary to apply a knowledge base to public health practice.

Learning Objectives:

The graduate of this program will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate knowledge of the concepts, principles, research, and practical application of the fundamentals of public health.
- 2. Demonstrate the ability to apply knowledge acquired in natural sciences, social sciences, and technology to public health.
- 3. Demonstrate knowledge of public health issues in contemporary society.
- 4. Demonstrate ability to think critically and creatively in solving problems about public health issues.
- 5. Develop knowledge and skills to prepare for transfer and/or post-baccalaureate employment.
