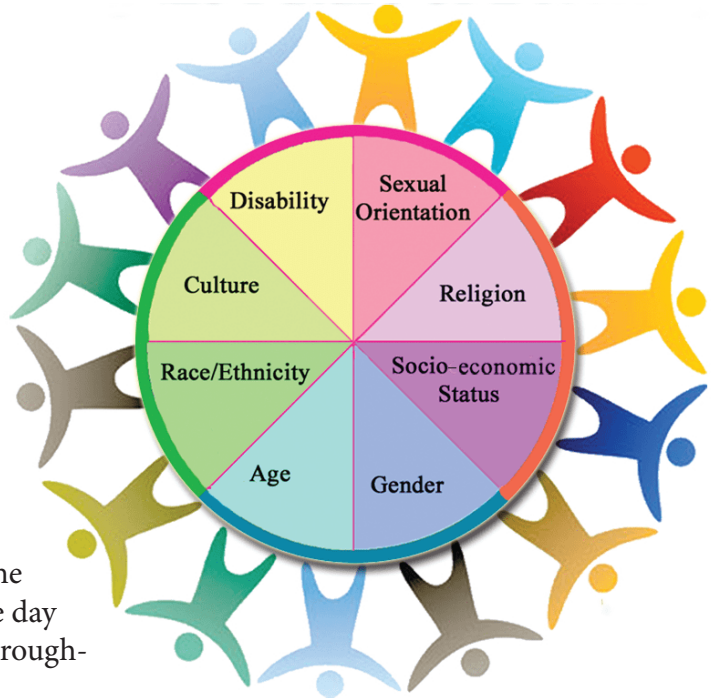
January/February 2018 Black History Month Events
