Articulation Agreement Between Luzerne County Community College Nanticoke, PA Associate of Applied Science in Early Childhood Education (AAS.ECE) And

> Keystone College LaPlume, PA

Bachelor of Science in Teaching: Early Childhood Education (certification) or Child and Family Studies (non-certification)

This Articulation Agreement (this "Agreement") is valid from the date of the last authorized signature below and effective for a period of time not to exceed five (5) years between Luzerne County Community College ("LCCC") and <u>Keystone College LaPlume PA</u> ("Institution"). This Agreement supersedes all previous agreements between LCCC and Institution ("Party" or "Parties") for the purpose of students transferring from LCCC to the Institution. The purpose of the Agreement is to facilitate the transfer of students from LCCC into Institution, and to support student academic success in baccalaureate degree programs.

This Agreement applies to students who received an Associate of Applied Science Degree in Early Childhood Education from LCCC. For those students, Institution agrees to accept the Early Childhood Education Program in the LCCC degree as meeting the requirements of 62 undergraduate credits within the B.S. in Teaching: Early Childhood Education Major (certification) or the Child and Family Studies (non-certification) as defined by the attached Programs of Study. Students at LCCC wishing to transfer to Institution will be advised using the attached advising sheet.

In order to ensure transfer and use of the articulation students need to:

- Complete an Intent to Enroll Form.
- Complete and receive the AAS.ECE degree from Luzerne.
- Maintain a GPA of 3.0 or higher and earn a "C" or better in all courses.
- Pass the PRAXIS or PAPA Basic Skills Tests in Reading, Writing, and Mathematics.
- Maintain current clearances in accordance with Act 34, 151, and 114.
- Complete the program as outline on the advising grid.
- Obtain a health appraisal with a negative TB Screening.
- Work closely with an advisor checking specific transfer requirements for the Institution.

Eligible LCCC graduates enrolling at Institution will be identified upon admission to Institution. Satisfaction of Institution general education requirements pursuant to this Agreement will be noted on all pertinent student records. Program to Program transfer does not alter the requirements of the student's major field of study or the requirements of the student's Institution. Students under the terms of this Agreement will need to complete, where applicable, any courses as designated by the student's major.

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The Parties agree to:

- 1. Consult with each other through appropriate channels prior to implementing major changes in policy or curricula that directly affect students transferring under the terms of this Agreement and keep each other informed of any other changes or policy or curricula that affect those students. The persons serving in the below positions will monitor compliance with the terms of this Agreement.

    b. Appropriate contact at Institution: <u>Dean, School of Professional Studies</u> (title) can be reached by phone by calling <u>570-945-8471</u> (phone number)
- 2. Identify positions and/or offices responsible for identifying and communicating to each other respective changes in the policies or requirements that affect this Agreement.
- 3. Collaborate in providing students with information and academic advising about this Agreement, the Parties academic programs and requirements, and the process of transferring to Institution.
- 4. Exchange data and documents that will contribute to the maintenance and improvement of this arrangement, enhance the transfer process, and promote effective cooperation between the Parties. When required by law, the Parties will exchange data only after obtaining appropriate permission from the student(s).
- 5. Facilitate and support consultation and collaboration between their faculties related to this Agreement, general education degree requirements, and other academic matters.
- 6. Nondiscrimination. Luzerne County Community College does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, disability or age in its programs or activities. General Terms and Conditions:

- 1. This Agreement represents the entire understanding between the Parties and can be modified only in writing with the same formality as the original Agreement.
- 2. This Agreement will be reviewed annually by the appropriate parties at each institution, and will automatically renew for a period of time not to exceed five (5) years. Not later than sixty (60) days prior to the end of the five (5) year period, each Party shall review and together make any changes to an updated Agreement to be considered for execution and implementation.
- 3. Either Party may terminate this Agreement at any time by written notice at least one (1) year in advance of the effective date of termination. Should this Agreement be terminated, it is understood that the termination will not apply to students already accepted to the Institution

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under the terms of this Agreement, but not yet enrolled in classes.

- 4. The Parties understand that they shall act in an independent capacity in the performance of this Agreement, and shall not be considered as employees, agents, affiliates, or subsidiaries of each other. Neither Party shall have the right to bind or obligate the other in any manner inconsistent with or unrelated to this Agreement.
- 5. This Agreement is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- 6. Neither Party shall assume any liabilities as a result of this Agreement. As to liability to each other or death to persons, or damages to property, the Parties do not waive any defense as a result of entering into this Agreement. Nothing herein shall be construed as a waiver of any immunities afforded LCCC by law or otherwise.
- Any notices to be given hereunder by any Party to the other may be affected with by personal delivery in writing or by mail, registered or certified, postage prepaid with return receipt requested. Mailed notices shall be addressed to the Parties at the addresses set forth hereinafter,

but each Party may change their address by written notice in accordance with this paragraph. Notices delivered personally shall be deemed communicated as of actual receipt; mailed notices shall be deemed communicated as of five (5) days after mailing.
